



Markham Issues Extreme Heat Alert

Residents Urged to Stay Cool

Markham, ON ~ June 19, 2012 Markham has issued an extreme heat alert due to Environment Canada's forecast of high temperatures over 30 degrees Celsius <u>and</u> a humidex reading that is expected to reach or exceed 40 in the Markham area over the next couple of days. The extreme heat alert will be in effect until 6 p.m. on Thursday, June 21, 2012.

During an extreme heat alert, residents are asked to take precautions to avoid suffering heat-related illnesses. Residents are also encouraged to call or visit family, friends and neighbours, especially isolated adults and seniors who are at greater risk of suffering from heat-related illness, to make sure they are cool and drinking plenty of fluids.

While extreme heat can put everyone at risk for heat-related illnesses, health risks are greatest for:

- □ Older adults;
- □ Infants and young children;
- People with chronic illnesses such as breathing difficulties, heart conditions, or psychiatric illnesses;
- People who work in the heat;
- □ People who exercise in the heat; and
- □ People without access to air conditioning.

As part of Markham's Hot Weather Response Plan, we have designated specific community centres and the Markham Civic Centre as cooling centres where residents can seek comfort from the extreme heat. A complete list of the designated cooling centres, public swimming and water play areas in Markham are included on the attached information sheet.

Markham encourages residents to stay cool, hydrated and healthy, and avoid leaving seniors, children or pets unattended in a car. For Markham recommendations based on Health Canada guidelines and more information on emergency preparedness, visit <u>www.markham.ca</u>.
